

A History Journey in Class 2

Intent= To engage children in a love of history, linking to real life uses and events with reading at the core of history investigation. Children follow the areas below and use the bubble planner on each Class page and then use half-termly assessments and National Curriculum expectation. Real time history is focussed on with current history with pupils as well as significant events are introduced from Year 1.

Implementation- Children in Key Stage 2 develop a chronological understanding of British, local and world history. They will search for evidence and carry out their own research to help them understand a range of different time periods.

History lessons are linked to our topics and provide children with cross-curricular links to literacy, maths and computing.

Impact- History is tracked through planners and pupils asked to recount to build memory skills Parents are given information at 2 separate consultation meetings to demonstrate progress. More able are moved on and those not at expected given personalised provision.

Pupils should be taught about:

- Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.
- The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain.
- Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Scots.
- The Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor.
- A local history study.
